Students will focus on:

Speaking and Listening:

Students create a vlog to present an argument to convince their community about an action that needs to be taken speaking in full, correct sentences: They will

- Describe the issue.
- Why is it a concern?
- Why would the community benefit from action being taken?
- Research your identified issue and gather and organise information, for example: by asking for community opinions or considering differing opinions.
- 2. Plan your vlog presentation. Use the planning sheet to help you. Think about:
- a hook that can be used to introduce your vlog
- how your vlog will be structured to ensure ideas are logically presented
- supporting details and evidence you will use (for example: graphics, sound and visuals that help with understanding and engagement)
- language choices that evoke emotions in the viewer and persuade them to agree with your position
- · ways to build cohesion
- the language to use with this audience consider levels of formality and language protocols
- how to summarise your main points and conclude your vlog to ensure the councillor takes action
- visual and digital features that can be used to support your argument and encourage your audience
